## In Our Neighborhood

There are many historic schools in the downtown Orlando area, two of these school are in the Delaney Park area—Cherokee School and Kaley Elementary.

**Kaley Elementary School (1600 East Kaley)** was constructed in 1935 as a Works Progress Administration (WPA) project. If you are not familiar with the WPA, it was the 1930's version of an *Economic Stimulus Package* put in place by the Roosevelt administration to get people working during the Great Depression.

The school is constructed of Depression bricks in an old English style of architecture. The school was somewhat unique when it was constructed with its sprawling, open horizontal layout, most schools at that time were typically multi-floor buildings to minimize land usage. This "open" design is now common among Florida schools. In 1995 Kaley Elementary was proclaimed a historical site by the Orlando Preservation Board & the City of Orlando.

The school originally was a traditional elementary school, it still serves a general K-5 population, as well as students in the Auditory-Oral Hearing Impaired, Educable Mentally Handicapped, Exceptional Education, and Varying Exceptionalities Programs. It is also the location for the district's Audiology Department.



Cherokee School

**Cherokee School (550 South Eola)** was finished in 1927 at a cost of approximately \$350,000. Its architecture is Spanish Colonial Revival with Exotic Revival elements. The exterior of the building features terra cotta ornamentation in a similar style to many of the larger homes that were being constructed in Orlando and Winter Park during the same period.

The school was originally Cherokee Junior High and served that purpose until 1952 when two new high schools (Boone and Edgewater) opened to replace Orlando High School. What had been the old Orlando High School became Howard Middle School and Cherokee in turn became an elementary school. Today Cherokee provides a program for students who are experiencing significant learning or emotional problems in grades K - 6.

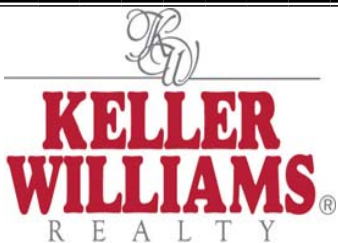
